ATC Licence Holder Responsibilities

As an Air Traffic Controller, Canadian Aviation Regulations (<u>CARs 402.04 (1)</u>) require that you are always in possession of a valid licence and medical certificate when working operational positions.

It is **your responsibility** as the licence holder to ensure you satisfy the requirements under CARs: to have a valid licence (proficiency checks are up-to-date) and valid medical certificate, and be able to produce it when exercising the privileges of your licence.

Please **DO NOT** let your licence expire.

Important Notes:

- Recently, there have been a few incidents across the country where people were found to be working without a valid licence and/or a medical certificate.
- Transport Canada is following up on these incidents. The maximum fine in CAR 103
 Schedule II is \$5,000/occurrence (i.e. \$5,000 for every shift without meeting CAR requirements).
- CATCA has no avenue to defend members if they receive a fine from Transport Canada. The issue is strictly between the Controller and Transport Canada.
